Pastor's Annual Report 2022

Dear Church for the Big Wood Family,

It might be possible to read this document's title, "Annual Report of the Congregation 2022" and think, "Ho-hum - that doesn't sound very exciting." Don't be fooled - for while the title might lack pizazz, what you will find in it has plenty of it, because it is focused on the exciting things happening at Church of the Big Wood, all of which point to God's faithfulness in our midst. For instance:

- Worship attendance (year over year) has increased significantly up about 40% from 2021, and exceeding pre-pandemic numbers.
- Involvement of children and youth is also way up so far this school year we are seeing 56% more children and youth here on Sunday mornings.
- Adult small groups continue to grow and thrive with thirteen groups active during our annual Fall Focus, at least ten of which continue to see. In addition, we have just started a new MOPS group a fellowship group for moms with children at home.
- Your generosity has resulted in the church giving over \$25,000 to those in need in our valley community through our Agape Fund, and over \$80,000 to mission causes such as an orphanage and school in Zambia, one of the poorest nations in the world.
- Our preschool is at maximum capacity, with 100 children enrolled.
- Thirty youth just returned from a retreat in the mountains, where relationships were built and while Jesus was lifted up.
- Members of this congregation are involved supporting community organizations like The Hunger Coalition, The Blaine County Charitable Fund, and the symphony.
- We have had folks who are part of our congregation make first time commitments to Jesus!
- Your generosity has allowed us to re-cover the sanctuary pews, replace the sanctuary carpet, and install needed new flooring in the preschool side of the building.

These are just a sampling of what could have been mentioned - pages and pages of other exciting things happening in our midst could have been listed. Again, these are not just numbers and statistics, but evidence - evidence of God's hand at work in our midst.

Which is why I want to encourage you to not be fooled by the report's title, but instead, as you read it, to allow God to encourage you by the evidence of His faithfulness. I know He has encouraged me!

2022 Annual Report for the Big Wood School

2022 has been a year of refreshing, reuniting, and reestablishing. After a couple of long Covid years, full of limiting, canceling, and closing, this year we embarked on the challenge of deciding on which aspects should return to "normal" and which things actually work better now under the adjusted methods. We have evaluated many areas and determined the practices and policies that allow us to operate most efficiently and effectively, while accommodating the needs and wants of our students, parents, and staff and fulfilling our mission. This has been no easy task, but the rewards far exceed the efforts.

Big Wood School received top honors in the Idaho Mountain Express Best of the Valley in 2022! We earned Gold Medals for Best Childcare Provider and Best Teacher and a Bronze for Best Private School. It was wonderful to be recognized in that way, but the true measure of our success is the amount of families that clamored to enroll their children at registration time. Within fifteen minutes of opening our online enrollment process, many of our classes and summer camp sessions were completely full! That amount of interest and urgency was unprecedented at our school. It is very satisfying to know that our school is in such high demand for providing a service so essential and valued in our community.

Some of the things that we were able to bring back to the school this year have included:

- Opening the wall of the Sharks Classroom, allowing a larger PreK group to occupy it (not limiting every group to a maximum of 10 students).
- Allowing parents to enter the building at pick-up and drop-off times to retrieve their children and belongings and interface with our staff.
- Combining classes of like ages for field trips, recess times, and gym play.
- Praising and worshipping as a group in the Sanctuary three days a week.
- Welcoming our entire school family to the Family Feast and serving 250+ Big Wood School students, families and friends a complete Thanksgiving lunch.
- Performing as a school at our "Christmas Carols and Cookies" show in December and our "Spring Spectacular" in April.
- Visiting various locations around the Valley on field trips that accompany our themes and lessons.
- Inviting guest speakers into the school for Dental Hygiene Week, Disability Week, Fire Prevention Week, etc.
- Providing tours of our facility to prospective families.
-just to mention a few.

Also, in 2022, we were tremendously blessed by some very substantial donations and incredible participation in our fundraising efforts. Due to the generosity of those in our church and school community, we finally changed our long-awaited dreams into reality by tackling some large school improvement projects. We replaced the old linoleum and tile flooring with beautiful vinyl wood planks and the damaged, worn-out carpeting with plush, fresh carpet. The change has been transformative. We also installed water bottle filling stations in the place of water fountains and replaced classroom furniture and fixtures that were out-dated and no longer functional. 2022 gave the school's appearance the boost it needed as we marked our 34th Birthday!

Since the Spring of 2022, it has been a joy to have Mr. Chris and Mr. Mark join us for Sanctuary Time every week. They bring the Bible to life and get the kids moving and grooving while they give praise to the Lord and worship in His name. They also helped us to prepare for our Christmas program and welcomed our students to be a part of Christmas Eve Services. he Big Wood students made the cutest nativity farm animals I ever did see!

We have gained momentum in so many ways over the past year. We head into the new year with knowledge, experience, and God's love and grace to strive to continue to make Big Wood School the best preschool it can be and to encourage every student in our care in their walk with the Lord and their spiritual growth.

Report from Big Wood School Elder:

Beside what our director, Kim, has mentioned in her report, I wanted to let you know what went on from the elder side with the school. Throughout our year, I tried to give support and encouragement behind the scenes. Several ways I did this was by acknowledging staff birthdays, giving them each bags of school supplies at the beginning of the school year, hosting several breakfasts and lunches, and giving support at the Big Wood School functions. Also Cindy Kirk and I led a Bible Study once a week throughout the year.

Kim and her staff run an organized, well oiled school. The staff are caring and go above and beyond their duties to make this school special. Their love and dedication is obvious and our congregation should be very proud of their efforts and let them know how we value them all.

2022 Annual Report for Children and Family Ministries

With Chris Neely, our Director of Family and Children's Ministry, beginning his first full year on staff, 2022 was an opportunity to introduce some new experiences while maintaining some of the classics. With that said, it's worth mentioning that the goal and purpose of everything that we did is defined by the following vision:

We believe that it's our role, as the Family and Children's Ministry, to come alongside families, through relationships, and to:

- Introduce children to Jesus Christ through our fun and interactive Sunday morning experience.
- Help children and families to fall in love with Jesus by seeing and experiencing Him through relationships with our volunteers and staff.
- Help children to grow in their faith by introducing them to everyday ways to follow Christ.
- Equipping, empowering, and encouraging parents to be the primary presenters of the Gospel in their children's lives and to help them to develop homes where Christ is the center of their family.

Of course, we've got to begin by highlighting our nursery. We want little ones to love coming to church (and we want their parents to love bringing them) that's why we believe so strongly in our nursery volunteer team. These ladies, many of whom are moms themselves, and their teenage helpers, consistently showed up all year long to love and make the little ones and their parents feel safe. That's because babies and preschoolers feel the safest when they are connected to familiar trusted adults. There may have been tears and tantrums, but there were also giggles and high-fives. In this ministry, we do so much more than just childcare - we plant seeds of God's love and truth in the hearts of little ones.

For our older preschoolers and children through fifth grade, we continued our fun, interactive Sunday morning experience that we simply like to call Big Wood Kids. Here, in our large group experience, children were able to get their wiggles out through songs and games before being introduced, through a practical, everyday example, to our Biblical content for the day. Then it was off to their small groups where they built relationships with our amazing volunteers and dove deeper into God's word. Every week, children were challenged to live out Jesus' love in their lives by following him and sharing his love with others.

Considering that we live in a resort area where life and attendance ebb and flow, our Sunday morning attendance consistently averaged over 20 children throughout the year with a high of 76 on Easter Sunday. We finished the year strong with attendance consistently pushing 30 children per week during the last four months of the year.

Throughout the year, we hosted several big events designed to help kids connect with each other, with their families, and with their small group and church leaders. Special events are often the place where kids and families walk into our ministry for the very first time. Some of our newer events included Parent's Night Out (a huge hit with parents), Fusion, Scream & Shout: School is Out, Donuts for Dads, the Rock Party, and our Retro Cartoons and Cereal Bar. At the same time, we continued hosting some of our classic events such as our Palm Sunday Celebration, Easter Eag Hunt, Tulips for Moms, Redfish Lake Day, VBS, and our children-led Christmas Eve service.

Great and successful efforts were made amongst our entire staff to seamlessly infuse our Big Wood School families with our church families so that we are ONE. All of the above events included families from both Big Wood School and the church with some of our greatest attendance at Parent's Night Out, the Rock Party, VBS, and our Christmas Eve service.

Once again, VBS was a huge success with almost 100 children and over 40 volunteers gathering each day to be encouraged and learn how they are God's masterpiece, created in His image.

One of the highlights of this year's VBS was that children raised almost \$1,600 for our mission, Good Shepherd's Fold in Uganda. That amount was matched by some generous families within our church and we were able to send a check for just over \$5,800 to GSF to support their ongoing work with orphans and families in need in Uganda.

Finally, we were particularly excited to start a couple of new ministry opportunities to parents in our valley. The first was an early morning Men's Bible Study for our younger men and dads. Our first series was well attended and we can't wait to kick-off our 2023 series with these men and many more. The second ministry that launched towards the end of the year was our Church of the Big Wood MOPS group. If you're not familiar with MOPS, it stands for Mothers of Preschoolers and has been around since the late 1970s. It's simply a place where mothers can belong and gather with other mothers to be encouraged and loved. We launched our first couple of months with our MOPS leadership team and are now ready to open the door to preschool moms across our valley.

2022 was an exciting year for our ministry and we are excited to continue that momentum into 2023.

2022 Annual Report of the Finance Committee

The church's total income for 2022 was \$818,000, which was \$6,000 more than budgeted, though \$39,000 less than received for 2021. Total expenses for the church were \$875,000, which exceeded budget by \$49,000. Spending exceeded budget due to increased staffing, higher building & grounds spending, and missions/outreach spending. These overages were approved by the Session during the year.

For 2022, the church had a net ordinary loss of \$57,000 compared to a budgeted loss of \$14,000. Due to substantial spending on capital projects in 2022, the church experienced an overall net deficit of \$197,000 for the year. It should be noted that a good portion of these capital projects had been reserved for in prior years. The year-end balance sheet remains strong with nearly \$720,000 in cash and investments and \$132,000 in liabilities.

The 2023 budget anticipates a net ordinary loss for the year of nearly \$65,000, which is \$8,000 worse than the actual result for 2022. We anticipate that inflationary pressures will drive an overall 3.9% increase in expenses, while we project a 3.1% increase in income. Fortunately, we do not anticipate substantial capital improvement spending in 2023.

While operating losses cannot be sustained for the long term, we are hopeful that inflationary pressures will dissipate and perhaps giving will increase. Session will continue to monitor the situation closely.

Session would like to express our deep appreciation for the support that the church has received this past year. This support has allowed the church to provide all its usual services and to fully support the church's Missions donations and the Agape Fund, which provides much needed help to families in the valley. In addition, the church continues to fund the Commons in Hailey, which is of great benefit in the church's outreach to youth in the valley and other ministries.

2022 Annual Report for Church Missions

The Overseers of the Missions at CBW are tasked with the privilege of "Touching the World for Christ". We accomplish this with our support of local, national, and international missionaries. This past year, we were blessed by the generosity of the congregation and given a budget of \$69,000. This is based on prior giving levels and equates to ten percent of the total CBW budget. During 2022, overall CBW giving was on par with our budget.

We, as a committee, also established a "reserve" fund. This was to be available to support any missionaries that feel God calling them after our budgets were set and to have available in the event of a shortfall. Last year, with the generosity of the congregation, we were able to support the following missions:

Locally

- 1. Youth Ministry (\$6,621) This fund supports our youth missions over and above the Youth Ministry Budget.
- 2. <u>SONDance Retreat Center (\$1,000)</u> This donation was used for helping maintain Mike and Teri Higgs' retreat center that helps ministers and missionaries heal, restore, and reignite their passion for the calling the Lord has placed on their hearts.
- 3. Global Community Partners in Boise: (\$3,600) Nick and Laura Armstrong (son-in-law and daughter of John and Jan Newcomb) work to build a bridge between the Church and the Nations at our doorstep in Boise, Idaho.
- **4.** The Big Wood Pre-School (\$9,496) This money was used for scholarships to the preschool for families that cannot afford the entire tuition. For some families in our community this is the only exposure to Christ their child may have and financially they were not able to afford the tuition.
- 5. The Agape Fund: (\$28,928) George Kirk, Jennifer Halverson and Todd Harmon manage this fund. It goes to help people who are in need of immediate financial aid (i.e. housing, utilities, food, medical treatments and medicines) to alleviate short-term cash flow strains due to illness, layoffs, medical issues, etc. This amount is about double what we've distributed in prior years, for obvious reasons, and your generosity towards this fund have led us to seek out community partners to more effectively put this fund to work.
- **6.** <u>The Hunger Coalition (\$4,500)</u> The money is used to help feed the hungry in Wood River Valley.
- 7. <u>Ketchum Community Dinners (\$1,000)</u> This money was used to help stock and support our community's efforts to feed our food-challenged with free meals served on Wednesday nights at St. Thomas Episcopal Church.

Miscellaneous Fund

Reserve Account: This account was established to be available for missionaries seeking support throughout the year or new missions that might arise. Due to your generosity, we were able to contribute to other missions such as Wood River Hospice, Suicide Prevention Hotline, and the Orphan Network.

Internationally

- Northrise University: (\$7,875) Located in Zambia, the money was used to sponsor four students for one year at this Christ Centered University and to help with Campus construction.
- Mapalo Orphanage (Give Hope for Life): (\$7,875) The money went for the general fund of the Orphanage and Academy to help with meals, teachers, and providing basic healthcare for approximately 350 students.
- 3. Living Water International: (\$3,900) Currently at work in 18 countries around the globe, partnering with communities to provide critically needed clean water, along with sanitation and hygiene training and education. In addition to clean water, LWI focuses on "Living Water", provided only by Jesus Christ all with and through the local church, transforming lives both physically and spiritually.
- 4. Christ In Youth: (\$3,900) "We call youth to Christ and into a life of Kingdom work through His Church." Through your support of CIY, you would be: sending teen and preteen students to events where they will encounter Jesus and learn what it means to be Kingdom workers, helping to reach teens and equip youth leaders in Europe. We are currently working in Ireland, and God is opening doors for further expansion into several countries in

northern Europe, helping create digital content that initiates God-centered conversations for youth ministries in several countries.

5. <u>Free Wheel Chair Missions: (\$500)</u> \$79 gets one manufactured and delivered wheelchair to over 91 developing countries.

As a missions committee, we want to encourage those whom the Lord has placed a call on their heart, to join us in prayer for these amazing servants of God, and their success in their missions. 2022 Annual Report for Personnel Committee

2022 was an active and encouraging year for our support of the vision "ForThe Valley". The activities supporting the vision included the Big Wood School, Family and Children's Ministry, Youth Ministry, Music and Worship services.

Big Wood School:

Kim and her staff had an outstanding year. The school's enrollment was again filled 100% with a "waiting list" approximating 50-60 potential students. The school also received the award of "Best Preschool in the Valley" by the Idaho Mountain Express polling data as well a Gold Award for Best Teachers and a Bronze for Best Private School. In fact, it opened up the door for them to continue pouring into the program through January and February. We took the Senior High to Grand Targhee for a ski retreat later in February. We had a wonderful time renting a house in Victor, ID and were able to eat meals together and hold Bible study in the evenings. We held a Fuel Super Bowl Trivia Party at the Commons as well as gathered on Tuesday nights for a girls Bible study throughout the rest of the winter.

Kyle and Sarah became an integral part of our program and we made the decision to hire them on as staff. We have been truly blessed by Sarah's intentionality as she continues to build relationships with the youth. Kyle's leadership has been a great addition to Fuel. 2022 Annual Report for the Worship Committee
